CONSTRUCTION

With a good stretch of weather, our crews installed 23,200 feet of fiber in the past two months! We continue to work in the original serving area updating copper infrastructure to fiber-to-the-home (FTTH) service. Homes on St. Anthony Road between Township Line Road and McMillan Road, as well as portions of Erastus Durbin Road, McMillan Road and Burrville Road now have access to FTTH service. If you are in this area and haven't scheduled a time to convert your services, give us a call.

Our crews have also been installing FTTH in Rockford in the area west of Main Street between Market Street and West South Street. This includes South Jay Street, South Vine Street, South West Street, South Franklin Street, West Pearl Street, West South Street, Wayne Street and Market Street.

If you know of anyone in this area, please refer them to Wabash service — we'll give you a \$25 credit on your bill for each new customer who gives your name when they order service. And, we'll give the new customer \$25 too! No limits!

Our team continues to make upgrades to our wireless network. Two more sites have been upgraded to LTE equipment in Rockford and northern Celina. The remaining sites are scheduled for LTE conversion.
